## Romans 3:23

For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard



Romans 3:23-24

For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard. <sup>24</sup> Yet God, in his grace, freely makes us right in his sight. He did this through Christ Jesus when he freed us from the penalty for our sins.

#### Ephesians 2:8-9

God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. <sup>9</sup> Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it.

That's what grace is: God's free gift to us.

#### Romans 6:23

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord.

Asking for God's free gift of forgiveness is an admission of guilt.

#### Romans 11:6

And since it is through God's kindness, then it is not by their good works. For in that case, God's grace would not be what it really is—free and undeserved.

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You'll never be able to do anything to deserve God's forgiveness, but you can receive it.

#### Romans 3:22-24

We are made right with God by placing our faith in Jesus Christ. And this is true for everyone who believes, no matter who we are. 23 For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard. 24 Yet God, in his grace, freely makes us right in his sight. He did this through Christ Jesus when he freed us from the penalty for our sins.

#### John 1:29

"Look! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!

#### Matthew 18:21

Then Peter came to him and asked, "Lord, how often should I forgive someone who sins against me? Seven times?"

#### Matthew 18:22

"No, not seven times," Jesus replied, "but seventy times seven!

#### Luke 17:4

Even if that person wrongs you seven times a day and each time turns again and asks forgiveness, you must forgive.

He expects us to forgive again and again because He forgives us again and again—as many times as are necessary.

His grace is big enough to see us through, even though we may fall along the way.

#### Romans 3:31

Well then, if we emphasize faith, does this mean that we can forget about the law? Of course not! In fact, only when we have faith do we truly fulfill the law.

#### Romans 6:14

Sin is no longer your master, for you no longer live under the requirements of the law. Instead, you live under the freedom of God's grace.

#### Romans 6:1
