

## Why say Abba (Dad)

Abba is a very familiar name for God, literally meaning "father" and is one who combines aspects of supernatural authority and care for his people (kids) — 'Father.' (Dad)

### Paul encouraged us to...twice

Romans 8:15 - For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!"





Luke 15:11-32 - The Prodigal Son (ESV)



Romans 5:6-11

8 but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. 10 For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son...

Misconception # 2
God really doesn't understand my
humanness and how weak I can be at times

# Jesus, your big brother and your advocate, can totally relate to you in every circumstance you face

**Misconception #3** 

Even after we are in right standing with God, we will almost always still self identify as a "slave" rather than a "Son"



Lots of times we feel like God just kind of tolerates us out of an obligation because of what Jesus did on the cross

John 17:22 -The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, 23 I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me.

Misconception # 4
We always feel like we need do
something to earn our way or clean
up in some way as we approach God.

You can't do anything or clean up enough to earn any part of your salvation, and God does complete pardons...not parole



This verse says everything about "identity"... who you are to God (Abba) through Jesus.

Maybe...it would be really good to recognize; that in this young man's worst moment...the "Dad" says, it's a perfect time to have a party.

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#### **MISCONCEPTION #5**

We live like we are under accusation all the time, and almost always from our own self talk...

Colossians 1:23 - if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister above reproach, that no can even bring an accusation about you, it won't even be heard.

God (Abba) never intended for you to find your identity in what you do ...even in your service to him.



### **Matthew 3:13–17**

17...this is my beloved son of whom I am well pleased.

### John 6:28-29

29 This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.

### Luke 10:17-20

20 Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."



Luke 15:31-32 - And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. 32 It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.'

What both boys missed was that the "Dad" was the prize.
Our "peace" and all he has is ours, if we stay in close proximity to Him.

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
