- ¹ Some Pharisees and teachers of religious law now arrived from Jerusalem to see Jesus. They asked him, ² "Why do your disciples disobey our age-old tradition? For they ignore our tradition of ceremonial hand washing before they eat."
- ³ Jesus replied, "And why do you, by your traditions, violate the direct commandments of God? ⁴ For instance, God says, 'Honor your

- ¹² Then the disciples came to him and asked, "Do you realize you offended the Pharisees by what you just said?"
- ¹³ Jesus replied, "Every plant not planted by my heavenly Father will be uprooted, ¹⁴ so ignore them. They are blind guides leading the blind, and if one blind person guides



another, they will both fall into a ditch."

- ¹⁵ Then Peter said to Jesus, "Explain to us the parable that says people aren't defiled by what they eat."
- 16 "Don't you understand yet?" Jesus asked.
- 17 "Anything you eat passes through the stomach and then goes into the sewer. 18 But the words you speak come from the heart—that's what defiles you. 19 For from the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, all
