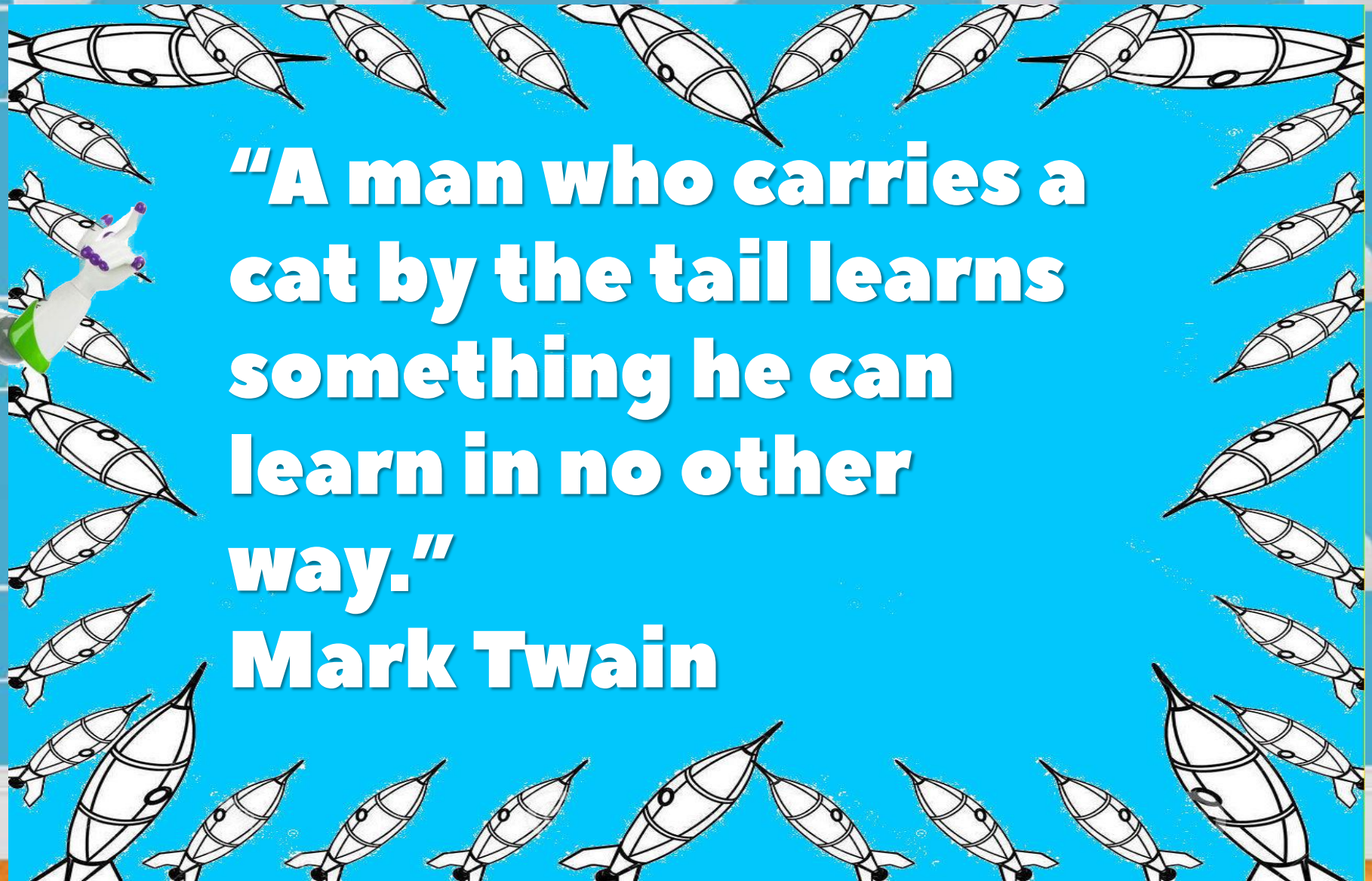

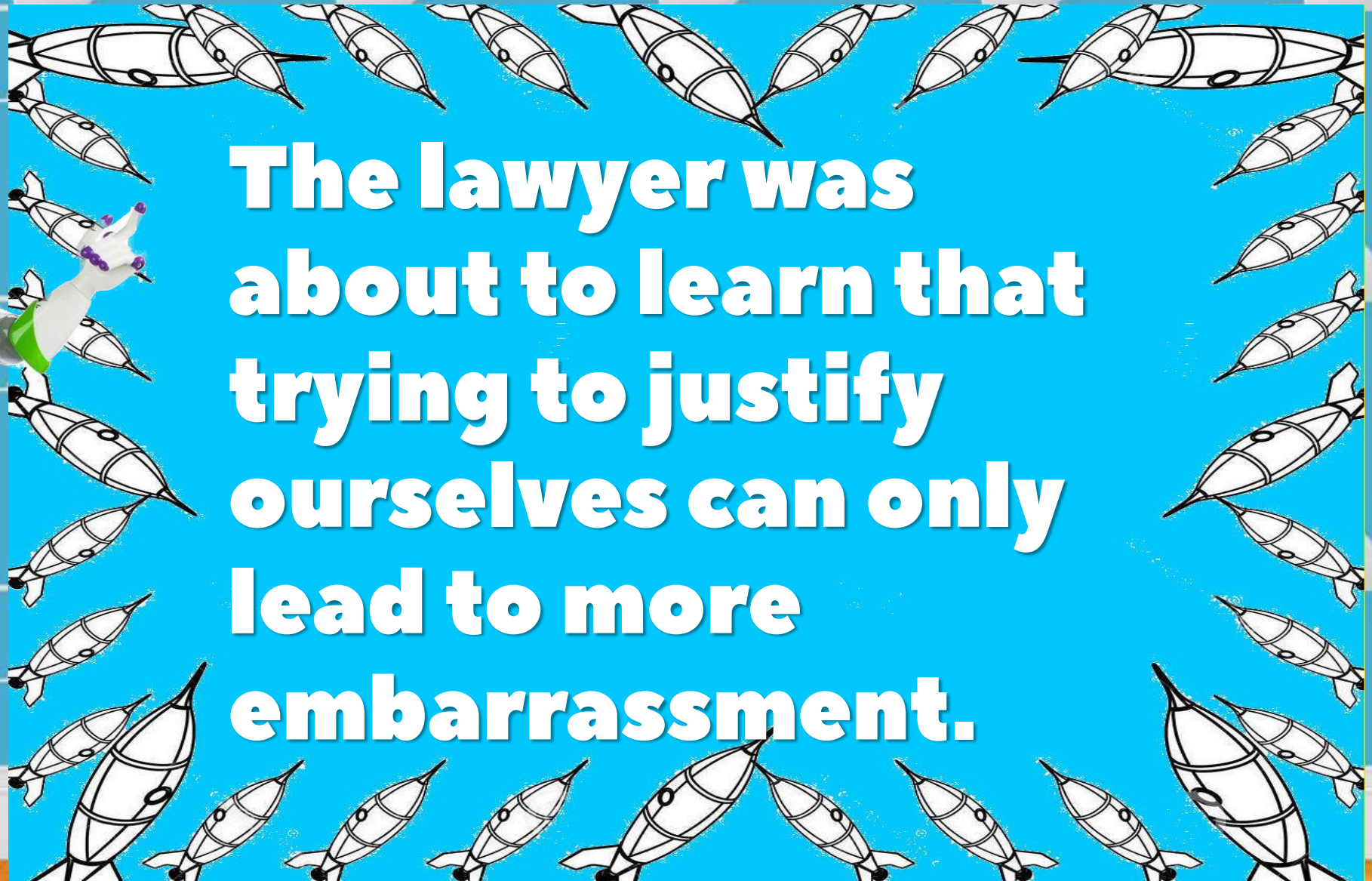

John 4:9

The woman was surprised, for Jews refuse to have anything to do with Samaritans. She said to Jesus, “You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. Why are you asking me for a drink?”

Yet this Samaritan who would have been despised by the Jews shows compassion:

He bandages the wounds, applying oil and wine

He puts the wounded man on his own animal and takes him to an inn

He gives the innkeeper two denarii (two days' wages) to provide care

He tells the innkeeper to spend whatever it takes, and he will repay him when he comes again

Luke 10:37

He sent messengers ahead to a Samaritan village to prepare for his arrival. ⁵³ But the people of the village did not welcome Jesus because he was on his way to Jerusalem. ⁵⁴ When James and John saw this, they said to Jesus, “Lord, should we call down fire from heaven to burn them up?” ⁵⁵ But Jesus turned and rebuked them.

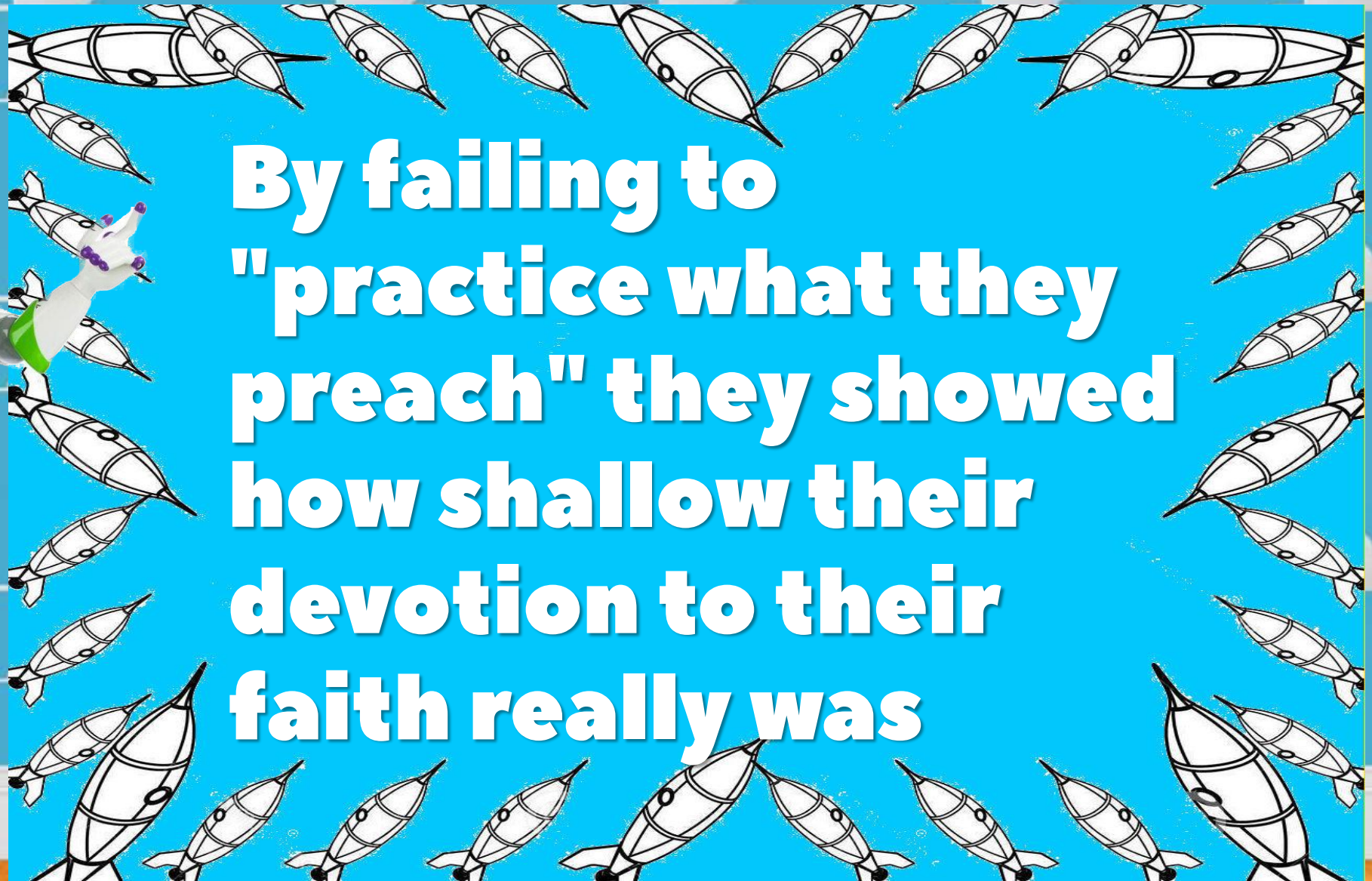
You Can't Separate Loving Jesus and Loving Others

James 1:2

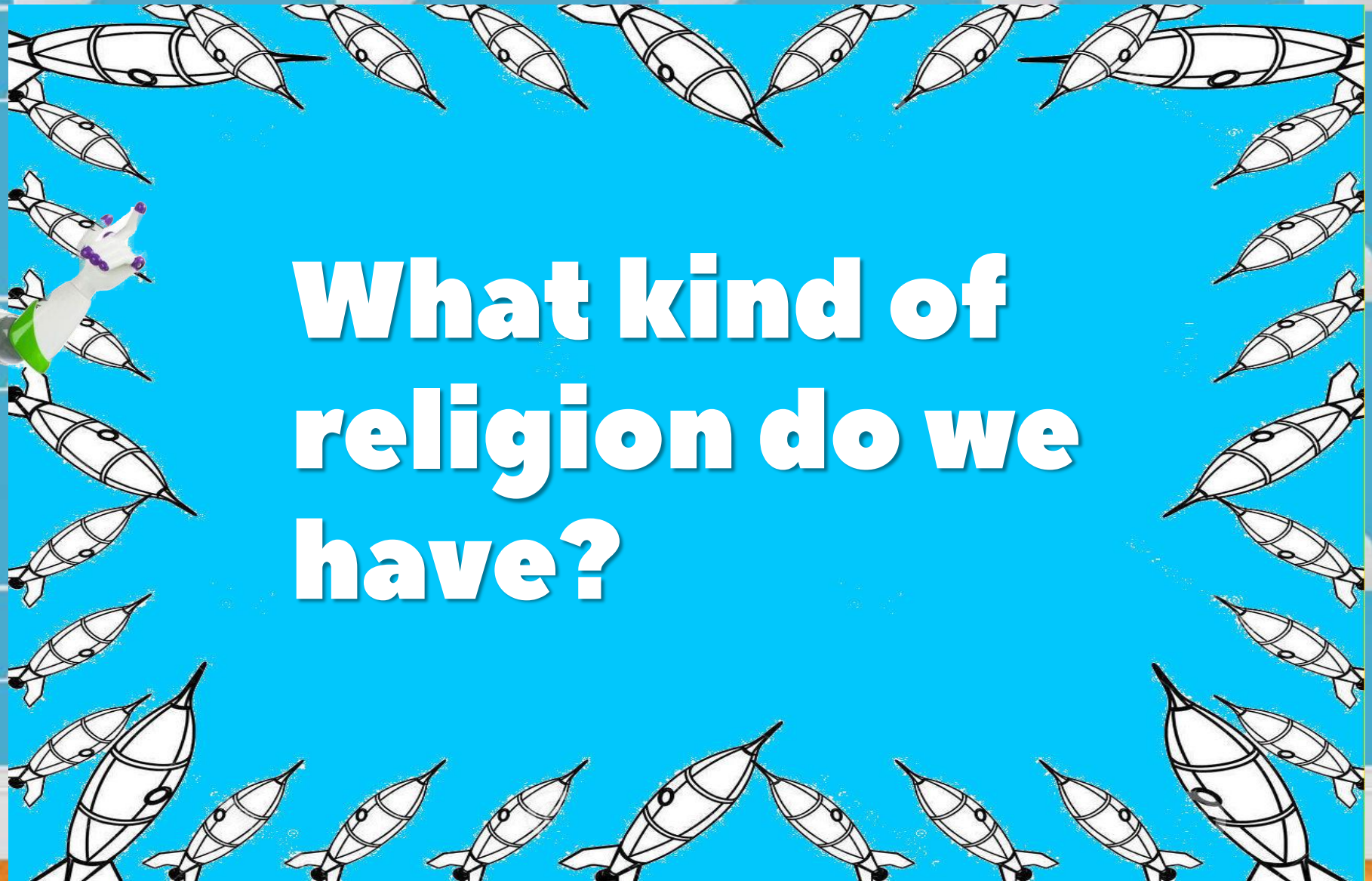
But don't just listen to God's word. You must do what it says. Otherwise, you are only fooling yourselves.
